Commissioner Valdez and Mr. Murphy discussed that this was also a willful, Citation 1 Item 1 and 2 were willful, Citation 2 is the same scenario as Lonigan Construction. Citation 1 was willful for the lack of certification, the owner knew he was required to have certification and had successfully taken the certification test twice before, but failed the third time.

Commissioner Valdez moved to approve the citation and proposed penalties as presented and Commissioner Everett seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Mr. Murphy discussed ADOSH's inspection, summarized the citation and proposed penalty.

Chairman Kavanaugh noted he had a request to speak.

Mr. Warren provided some background, they were installing underground conduit in the trench and within an hour of being made aware of the violation, the concrete guy came back and put on the covers, it was corrected as soon possible and have pictures. They did a safety meeting the following week about impalement hazards and making sure all rebar and concrete stakes have caps.

Mr. Murphy noted the multi-employer policy that even if another employer creates a hazardous condition and you are exposing your employees to that hazardous condition even though you are not creating it or have the correcting abilities of it, you cannot expose your employees to it, you have to notice the person who has the ability to correct it or the general contractor.

Vice Chair Hennelly asked Mr. Murphy if he was aware of the photographs. Mr. Murphy commented that he appreciated that it was abated quickly and was not sure if the employer provided the pictures to the Compliance Officer.

Mr. Warren noted abatement photographs were submitted to the Compliance Office within two hours of the inspection.

Vice Chair Hennelly moved to amend the citation and proposed penalties. Because of the prompt attention to abatement he suggested a 20% Good Faith Discount for a total of \$4,286.00. Commissioner Everett seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Mr. Murphy discussed ADOSH's inspection, summarized the citation and proposed penalty, and reviewed the photographs.

Chairman Kavanaugh noted he had two request to speak.

Ms. Harry addressed the Commission, she is the Director of HR. For Items 1 and 2 regarding lock out/tag out are provided to all new hires on a training portal which includes a video prepared by the equipment manufacturer and how to perform a lock out/tag out procedure. \The training app/portal is required to complete within the first three days before they make contact with any equipment, and a certificate of completion is provided so they know they have completed the training. They have confirmation and a certificate for the injured employee. Item 3, this employee was in violation of company policy, employees or maintenance technicians are not allowed to perform any cleaning or maintenance during business hours, this employee was in violation of that and he wanted to leave early and started to clean up early in violation of company policy. You are not allowed to hold any equipment in the tunnel during operation hour, and that is when this incident occurred. The employee was reprimanded for violation of company policy, and noted the training video shows the same thing that happened to this employee and he knew the dangers. For Item 4 hazard communication is also in the training portal and required to be completed by all employees and have certificates of completion. All of the information was provided to the investigator providing all of the online training that is required, unfortunately this incident was poor judgement by the employee and a violation of company policy.

Vice Chair Hennelly asked Ms. Harry about the materials that are online on a portal called Train You Well and all new hires are required to complete with 24 to 48 hours. It is done on their first day on site and are provided a link and can do it on their phone as paid training and there is follow-up to make sure everybody in the company has completed it. Ms. Harry noted records were provided as part of the package submitted.

Mr. Mattfold noted he had nothing to add to Ms. Harry's comments.

Mr. Murphy noted that based on the interviews it was a common practice about a half hour before closing employees would start cleaning and it was common practice to use the emergency stop instead of the lock out/tag out procedures. Management stated that is the way he does the process to hit the emergency stop which is not authorized for lock out/tag out procedures. He noticed in the file a one page document explaining what lock out/tag out is and was more like a flyer and not a program.

Vice Chair Hennelly moved to remand back to ADOSH for further discussion with the employer to resolve contested issues and Commissioner Valdez seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Discussion and/or Action regarding the consideration of Appointment of Interim Director of the Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health. The Commission may vote to discuss this matter in executive session pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(1).

Chairman Kavanaugh recognized and thanked Mr. Norton for all his years of service for the Commission and in the industry for worker safety.

Chairman Kavanaugh noted because of Mr. Norton's resignation an Interim Director of Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health is needed while a national search and asked if there was a motion to recommend to appoint an Interim Director.

Chairman Kavanaugh moved to appoint Mr. Murphy to the position as an Interim Director of Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health. Vice Chair Hennelly seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Chairman Kavanaugh congratulated Mr. Murphy and looks forward to continue to work with him in this new capacity.

Mr. Testini announced that a menorah was placed in the lobby.

Ms. Dimas announced the retirement of Tina Rivera, the Administrative Assistant II in the Labor Division after 30 years.
