Mr. Atencio discussed ADOSH's inspection, summarized the citation and proposed penalties, and reviewed the photographs.

Chairman Schultz and Mr. Atencio discussed ladder safety for access to and from the roof which was not an issue in this case.

Chairman Schultz and Mr. Atencio also discussed that PPE was not available on site.

Chairman Schultz asked about the history report not showing the prior inspection. Mr. Atencio noted with the new system it did not transfer over and ADOSH is working with the vendor to correct that issue.

Commissioner LeMarr noted the previous citation was a year ago and asked if the fine was paid and seems like the employer had not learned a lesson. Mr. Atencio noted he would have to check if the citation was paid.

Commissioner LeMarr moved to approve the citation and proposed penalties as presented and Commissioner Everett seconded the motion. Chairman Schultz, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner LeMarr and Commissioner Everett voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Mr. Atencio discussed ADOSH's inspection, summarized the citation and proposed penalties, and reviewed the photographs and described the wet room for chemicals.

Chairman Schultz inquired about the different chemicals and chemical reaction with each other. Mr. Atencio noted the chemicals were appropriately labeled and in different areas.

Chairman Schultz and Mr. Atencio discussed the location of the bump shower shown in photograph #2 and that there was an unobstructed walkway to get to it. Mr. Atencio also explained the PPE worn by the employees.

Chairman Schultz asked about the respiratory program and Mr. Atencio noted it was lacking a couple of the required elements.

Chairman Schultz questioned whether a company this size with the potential chemical exposure would have a full-time safety person or a contract person. Mr. Atencio checked the notes but it was not mentioned, however, based on his experience some companies will hire a safety person, but others will hire a company to get a baseline and annual reviews, or their insurance company will often supplement safety and health and have an Industrial Hygienist ("IH") or safety person for an independent audit to help the employer. The standard does not require them to have a safety professional on staff. Chairman Schultz was surprised and would expect the insurance carrier to strongly recommend it and suggested a letter of recommendation be sent to include the importance of a safety professional. Mr. Atencio also noted any of these companies that have corrosive chemicals are required by ADEQ and some counties to contact their local fire department and have a walk through of the facility. Mr. Atencio noted in the letter of recommendation they can encourage them to contact their insurance carrier and have an industrial hygienist walk through the facility and help out with program development and to contact their local fire department to schedule a visit to make sure everything is good.

Commissioner Everett moved to approve the citation and proposed penalties as presented and Commissioner LeMarr seconded the motion. Chairman Schultz, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner LeMarr and Commissioner Everett voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Announcements, Scheduling of Future Meetings and Retirement Resolutions.

Mr. Ashley noted that the Special Government Employee ("SGE") training the ICA hosted in the auditorium to assist with the Voluntary Protection Program concluded today. Of two dozen participants, many were from out of state throughout Federal OSHA's Region IX. Arizona has one of the largest SGE programs in the nation. For reference, Arizona has 70 trained SGEs while California has 72.

Chairman Schultz commented we have 70 experts available to us at no cost to the state, because we have these collaborative programs with employers giving us the highly trained professionals. One amazing feature is they work with their competitors to help improve their programs because they are so dedicated to workplace safety.

Mr. Ashley welcomed and introduced the ICA Claims Division leadership and staff and highlighted multiple successes in the division and reviewed several accomplishments for the Awards, Wage, Compliance, No Match, Insurance, File Room, and Data Entry teams as well as the

Auditing/Compliance/Training team and out-of-state adjuster training program. Mr. Ashley presented the Golden Hard Hat to Claims' Average Monthly Wage ("AMW") team for the month of March for their work on new wage solicit processes.

Chairman Schultz commented on the work that is performed by the division to take care of injured workers in Arizona.
