Chairman Kavanaugh convened the meeting at 1:00 p.m. In attendance, confirmed by roll call were Anne Ryman (ABC15); Paige Millan (Snell and Wilmer); Emily Bloom (ANM Roofing); Kris Leonhardt, Nermana Grinnan (Fisher Phillips); and James Countryman.

Approval of Minutes of October 12, 2023 Regular Meeting Minutes.

Commissioner Everett moved to approve the Minutes of the October 12, 2023 regular session meeting and Vice Chair Hennelly seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Consent Agenda:

All items following under this agenda item are consent matters and will be considered by a single motion with no discussion unless a Commissioner asks to remove an item on the consent agenda to be discussed and voted on separately. The Commission may move into Executive Session under A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(2) to discuss records exempt by law from public inspection. Legal action

Commissioner Valdez moved to approve the items on the Consent Agenda and Commissioner Everett seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Discussion regarding the Statutory Assessments for Calendar Year 2024.

Ms. Simpson presented an update to prior budget assessment. Ms. Simpson discussed the Assessment setting for FY25 budget. Under the new executive team, it has been determined that an additional 2.2 million should be requested to hire additional staff.

In the past eight years the Commission has been held to 216 Full Time Employees (FTE) by ADOA. The Legislation appropriated 236 FTE to the agency.

The ICA has taken on additional responsibilities due to new voter legislative initiatives. Proposition 206 added new programs to the Labor Department with earned paid sick time and earned paid sick time retaliation. With the addition of these programs, it has created more matters for the ALJ Division due to the appeals of the Labor Division.

The creation of ARS §§ 23-1061 (N) have added extra burdens for the Claims Division which require new procedures. The recent passage of A.R.S. §§ 23-934 creates a new fraud unit in the Legal Division will also require staffing of three new FTE's.

If approved this will bring up the appropriation to 24.2 million and the ICA is required to show evidence that the funds are available.

Vice Chairman Hennelly requested additional information for review. Ms. Simpson responded and will provide the required information. Chairman Kavanaugh and Sylvia discuss the positions and the rate setting.

Commissioner Valdez moved to approve issuance of a Penalty for Retaliation in the amount of \$21,003.00 to Holiday Lighting Company AZ, Inc. Commissioner Everett seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

2. RT-2324-0012 - ASM Global Parent, Inc

Ms. Spurgeon summarized the Labor Department's investigation into the Earned Paid Sick Time (EPST) Retaliation claim. Ms. Spurgeon recommended that the Commission approve issuance of a Penalty in the amount of \$14,850.00 for violation of A.R.S. § 23-364.

Chairman Kavanaugh moved to approve issuance of a Penalty for Retaliation in the amount of \$14,850.00 to ASM Global Parent, Inc. Commissioner Valdez seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

3. RT-2324-0016 - Southwest Airlines Co

Ms. Spurgeon summarized the Labor Department's investigation into the Earned Paid Sick Time (EPST) Retaliation claim. Ms. Spurgeon recommended that the Commission approve issuance of a Penalty in the amount of \$47,400.00 for violation of A.R.S. § 23-364.

Commissioner Everett moved to approve issuance of a Penalty for Retaliation in the amount of \$ 47,400.00 to Southwest Airlines Co. Commissioner Valdez seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

4. RT-2324-0018 - Lost Dutchman Coffee Company

Ms. Spurgeon summarized the Labor Department's investigation into the Earned Paid Sick Time (EPST) Retaliation claim. Ms. Spurgeon recommended that the Commission approve issuance of a Penalty in the amount of \$19,716.93 for violation of A.R.S. § 23-364.

Commissioner Valdez moved to approve issuance of a Penalty for Retaliation in the amount of \$19,716.93 to Lost Dutchman Coffee Company. Vice Chair Hennelly seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Ms. Spurgeon summarized the Labor Department's investigation into the Earned Paid Sick Time (EPST) Retaliation claim. Ms. Spurgeon recommended that the Commission approve issuance of a Penalty in the amount of \$21,450.00 for violation of A.R.S. § 23-364.

Commissioner Everett moved to approve issuance of a Penalty for Retaliation in the amount of \$21,450.00 to Southwest Airlines Co. Vice Chair Hennelly seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

8. MW-2324-0005 - MEI Consulting

Ms. Spurgeon summarized the Labor Department's investigation into the Minimum Wage claim. Ms. Spurgeon recommended that the Commission approve issuance of a subsequent Civil Penalty in the amount of \$1,000.00 for violation of A.R.S. § 23-364.

Vice Chair Hennelly moved to approve issuance of a subsequent Civil Penalty for violation in the amount of \$1,000.00 to MEI Consulting. Commission Everett seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Discussion and Action of Resolution Appointing Custodian of Records.

Director Testini requested a Resolution appointing Ms. Scharf as a Custodian of Records in the Claims Team.

1. WB-2023-0014 James Countryman vs McDonald's

Mr. Brandt Smith presented the investigation timeline of Mr. Countryman's complaint. After investigation, the ADOSH Director, Legal and Mr. Smith determined that the case should be closed due to the complaint not being signed and therefore filed untimely.

Chairman Kavanaugh asked if there are any discussions or recommendations. Commission Chairman Kavanaugh comments that they have the ability to render a decision to affirm the determination of the ADOSH Director, remand back to ADOSH for further investigation or direct the Legal Division to send to Superior Court.

Commissioner Everett moved to confirm the ADOSH decision to close the case and Vice Commissioner Valdez seconded the motion. Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh voted nay. The motion passed 3 to 1.
