## State Emphasis Program (SEP) Outdoor and Indoor Heat-Related Hazards

The Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health (ADOSH) implemented this SEP, with an effective date of July 17, 2023. The goal of this SEP is to reduce worker exposures to heat-related hazards that result in illnesses, injuries, and deaths, by inspecting industries and worksites.

## As an employer, some questions to ask yourself to see if you are prepared. If not, ADOSH can assist you!

- Q: Do you know the signs and symptoms of heat illness?
- Q: Do your employees know the signs and symptoms of heat illness?
- Q: What do you have in place if an employee shows symptoms of heat exposure?
- Q: Do you provide time for acclimatization of new and returning workers?
- Q: Do you monitor ambient temperature(s) and levels of work exertion at the worksite?
