a) North East Scaffold: An employee was required to install an angle beam by standing on the second level of a scaffold that was not fully planked. 29 CFR 1926.451(b)(1)

<u>SERIOUS</u> – Citation 1 - Item 4 –

a) North East Scaffold: An employee was required to install an angle beam while standing on a scaffold that was approximately ten feet eleven inches above the next lower level without being provided scaffold training to recognize the hazards. 29 CFR 1926.454(a)

SERIOUS – Citation 1 - Item 5 –

a) South Stairwell: Employees were exposed to an impalement hazard due to the rebar not being capped to protect employees as they stepped onto the second floor, and stepped out. 29 CFR 1926.701(b)

Mr. Murphy discussed ADOSH's inspection, summarized the citation and proposed penalties.

Vice Chair Hennelly asked if there was consideration given to grouping the four items related to the North East Scaffold.

Mr. Murphy noted the compliance officer considered grouping, but chose not to group.

Vice Chair Hennelly, Mr. Murphy and Commissioner Everett discussed abatement and confirmed Items 1 through 5 have been abated, the non-serious item has not been abated.

Chairman Kavanaugh checked if anyone would like to comment.

Vice Chair Hennelly moved to amend the citation and proposed penalties. Because of the good faith effort to abate the violations, he suggested a 10% Good Faith Discount for a total penalty amount of \$16,878.00. Commissioner Valdez seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett, Commissioner Valdez and Commissioner Godfrey voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Ms. Dimas also announced the retirement of Patricia Martinez, a Customer Service Representative II in the Labor Division who is retiring after 33 years of service.
