Ms. Spurgeon summarized the Labor Department's investigation into the Earned Paid Sick Time (EPST) Retaliation claim. Ms. Spurgeon recommended that the Commission approve issuance of a Penalty in the amount of \$3,000.00 for violation of A.R.S. § 23-364.

Chairman Kavanaugh asked if the Commissioners had any questions.

Commissioner Godfrey moved to approve issuance of a Penalty for Retaliation in the amount of \$3,000.00 to Bisbee Hospital Association. Commissioner Everett seconded the motion Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett, Commissioner Valdez and Commissioner Godfrey voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Discussion and Action regarding Proposed Sick Time Subsequent Civil Penalty.

1. ST-2425-0052 American Healthcare Solutions LLC

Ms. Spurgeon summarized the Labor Department's investigation into a violation of A.R.S. § 23-372(A) and A.R.S. § 23-375(C) for a prior Earned Paid Sick Time (EPST) Retaliation claim. Ms. Spurgeon noted on May 23, 2024 the Labor Department assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$250.00 for violating the same statute, which was not paid by the employer. On August 19, 2024 the Labor Department received another complaint against the employer for the same violation. The employer is still not in compliance with the statute. The Department recommended issuance of a subsequent Civil Penalty of \$1,000.00 for violation of A.R.S. § 23-372(A).

Commissioner Godfrey moved to approve the issuance of a Subsequent Civil Penalty in the amount of \$1,000.00 to American Healthcare Solutions LLC. Vice Chair Hennelly seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett, Commissioner Valdez and Commissioner Godfrey voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Mr. Hudson discussed ADOSH's inspection, summarized the citation and proposed penalty.

Chairman Kavanaugh noted he had a request to speak from Mr. O'Hair.

Mr. O'Hair, the President of The Paint Kings, stated the family-owned company has been in business since 1987. He reviewed the company's safety policy utilizing a third-party safety company to help them tailor their safety program. He talked about the incident and the tie off that was not provided by the builder. He noted when that is not available, the workers are instructed and trained to do a controlled access zone and have a safety monitor. He noted the training prior to the incident and provided documentation. He noted the employee slipped on stucco debris and lost his footing, they had a controlled access zone and safety monitor. When he went to the hospital, the hospital scheduled the surgery for the next morning and asked if he wanted to stay the night and he did, when they found out the next morning they reported the hospitalization. They followed their written policies and what he was instructed to do.

Chairman Kavanaugh and Mr. Hudson discussed Mr. O'Hair's comments about no tie offs and options for the right fall protection for the job and the injury did occur.

Commissioner Godfrey noted the efforts by the employer are commendable, and rarely does an employer come in and speak about all of the things they have done; however the counterpoints make it clear there was a violation of safety standards.

Chairman Kavanaugh, Commissioner Godfrey, Mr. Hudson and Vice Chair Hennelly discussed fall protection and the need for an assessment prior to getting on the roof, and the need for both citations, if it was addressed in the first citation.

Commissioner Godfrey moved to amend Citation 1, Item 1 and suggested at 15% reduction for employer efforts and because Citation 1, Item 2 is not based upon a proper application of the FOM to remove Citation 1, Item 2 from consideration for a total of \$9,795.00. Commissioner Everett seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett, Commissioner Valdez and Commissioner Godfrey voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.
