Mr. Hudson and Chairman Kavanaugh discussed notice to employers for incidents that require reporting.

Announcements, Scheduling of Future Meetings and Retirement Resolutions.

Mr. Testini informed the Commissioners that earlier today Governor Hobbs issued Executive Order 2025-09, entitled "Protecting Arizonans from Heat Risks in the Workplace." The Executive Order has two main functions: The establishment of workplace heat safety task force; and the creation of a recognition program for those employers who go above and beyond the minimum standards to provide heat safety protection for their employees. The task force will be comprised of people from industry, labor, and advocacy groups with the requirement for them to have recommendations by December 2025.

Mr. Testini announced Brandt Smith will be joining the Director's Office as an additional Deputy Director for the agency.

Chairman Kavanaugh commented on the task force; his understanding is the recommendations will come to the Commission with the idea that the Commission would review their recommendation or guidelines for the purpose to help provide guidance and interpretations of the general duty clause.

Mr. Testini noted the recommendation would first go to the ADOSH Advisory Committee and then to the Commission.

Ms. Dimas confirmed Commission meeting dates through July 2025.
