This supplemental public hearing is being 9 10 held to give members of the public and Commission 11 stakeholders an opportunity to comment on the Amended 12 Staff Proposal regarding the 2020/2021 Arizona Physicians' and Pharmaceutical Fee Schedule and to make 13 14 additional recommendations for changes to the Fee 15 Schedule. 16 On May 22nd, the Commission posted the 17 initial Staff Proposal, and a public hearing was held 18 on June 25th, 2020. Based on public comments received, the Staff Proposal was amended and was reposted for 19 20 additional comment and a supplemental public hearing. The Amended Staff Proposal has been posted on the 21 22 Commission's website since July 17. 23 To help with background noise, your phones 24 have been put on mute. 25 Charles Carpenter, the Manager of the Medical

Resource Office, will provide a brief overview of the Amended Staff Proposal.

Charles.

MR. CARPENTER: Thank you, and good afternoon, Mr. Chairman, Commissioners, Director Ashley, colleagues, and guests.

Thanks for the time to present the Amended Staff Proposal for the 2020/2021 Physicians' and Pharmaceutical Fee Schedule.

The Medical Resource Office originally presented the 2020/2021 Staff Proposal on June 25th.

And today we do have an Amended Proposal:

The Medical Resource Office references the 2020 Medicare Physician Fee Schedule; OPTUM 360's 2020 publication, The Essential RBRVS; Office of Workers' Compensation Fee Schedule, effective October 1st, 2019; the 2020 Anesthesia Base Units, as listed in CPT-4; 2020 Clinical Diagnostic Laboratory Fee Schedule; and Physicians as Assistants at Surgery: 2018 update.

Staff recommends the updated service codes, relative value units and reimbursement values as presented in the Amended Excel tables accompanying the published proposal. The methodology in computing reimbursement values has not changed from previous years.

Staff recommends maintaining the RBRVS conversion factors from the 2019/2020 Fee Schedule. And the proposed Fee Schedule continues to use CMS's surgical global periods, assign RVUs to consultation services, delineate codes that are unique to Arizona, and not incorporate a geographical adjustment factor.

The proposed Fee Schedule continues to designate Medi-Span as the source to determine Average Wholesale Price and determine reimbursement values for pharmaceutical products.

Staff evaluated changes to the 2020 Medicare Physician Fee Schedule and the 2020/2021 proposal is intended to conform with changes from previous editions.

Changes were made throughout the 2020/2021
Fee Schedule to clarify the language or to clarify the definition and usage of the terms "physician" and "healthcare provider". This change is intended to conform with the language used by CMS, which defines "physicians" as those healthcare providers who can provide Evaluation and Management services according to their scope of practice and Arizona law.

The Introduction section contains additional updates, including the addition of statutory language to reinforce the timelines and expectations established

by Arizona Revised Statute 23-1062.01, which requires payers to provide proof of valid contracts when questions about negotiated fees with healthcare providers arise, and clarifying that a current invoice for materials and supplies is one which is dated within one year of use.

Staff proposes the inclusion of four HCPCS codes which were adopted by the Commission in March as a response to the spread of COVID-19. Two of the codes are for Virtual Check-ins by physicians, and they represent changes to the Evaluation and Management Section. The other two codes are used for lab testing to detect a COVID-19 infection and are found in the Pathology and Laboratory Section.

A proposed change to the 2020/2021 Fee Schedule is intended to address questions and concerns regarding Code AZ099-005. This billing code is used when healthcare providers spend additional time completing workers' compensation insurance forms.

During the course of typical treatment, each respective healthcare provider is expected to properly document their work according to the laws governing their respective practices.

Exams, re-exams, evaluations, and consultations are currently paid at a rate to

compensate the healthcare provider for their time to document patient encounters. Code AZ099-005 is intended only in cases when additional paperwork is required either by the Commission, applicable payer, or third-party administrator.

In addition to public comments made during the June 25th hearing, the Commission received four written comments. They have been posted to the MRO webpage. And based on those public comments, the original staff proposal was amended and reposted for additional written comment and a supplemental public hearing, which we're here doing today.

So the only change to the content of the original proposal is the removal of the Stop Gain and an adjustment of the Stop Loss percentage from 25 percent, which was used in the 2019/2020 Fee Schedule, to 50 percent.

The removal of the Stop Gain will ensure that reimbursement values for applicable codes will be based solely on the updated RVUs and the corresponding conversion factor -- without setting an artificial ceiling on the reimbursement value of any codes whose value under the RBRVS system is higher than the values of the same codes before the Commission transitioned to the RBRVS model.

The modification of the Stop Loss from 25 percent to 50 percent is proposed to move the Commission closer to a full adoption of the RBRVS approach, while at the same time we continue to gradually reduce the reimbursement value of certain codes whose value under the RBRVS approach is significantly less than the reimbursement value of the same code before the Commission transitioned to the RBRVS model.

The Amended Staff Proposal includes two other additions. The first addition is the proposed adoption of a standard for time-based services. The proposed language is found in the Physical Medicine Guidelines of the Fee Schedule and establishes that the -- that the CMS Guidelines be used when billing and reimbursing time-based services.

Adopting this standard ensures uniformity in the reimbursement of time-based services. Second, the Amended Staff Proposal includes some proposed amendments to the Pharmaceutical Fee Schedule Guidelines. The intent of the amendments is to clarify the definitions of a "pharmacy accessible to the general public" and a "pharmacy not accessible to the general public" and to correct an inadvertent omission in Section VII(A)(1).

The proposed amendments also include a new, narrow exception to the general rule that would allow a pharmacy not accessible to the general public to dispense and receive payment for medications that are dispensed to an injured worker only during a compensability dispute that ultimately resolves in favor of the injured worker.

This new exception will make it easier for injured workers' whose claims have been denied to receive prescription medication services during the period of time in which they are protesting the denial of their claim.

So the Medical Resource Office -- we appreciate the time of the Commission in consideration of the Amended Staff Proposal.

CHAIRMAN SCHULTZ: Thank you, Charles.

We now welcome you to present your oral arguments and recommendations regarding the Amended Staff Proposal on the 2020/2021 Fee Schedule. I'm in I think that the changes to the Fee 21 agreement. 22 Schedule or the Proposed Fee Schedule are very well 23 done. 24 I still am a little -- maybe not so much 25 concerned or confused about the definition of the

pharmacy accessible to the general public, not that I'm in any way against the language. I understand what the intent that the Commission is trying to do.

I just want to make sure that -- that the definition of pharmacy accessible to the general public could be a pharmacy such as a mail order pharmacy being utilized because that particular insurer may have a contract with a PBM that provides all services, including mail order as an option.

My fear is that future -- in the future those -- those words could be potentially twisted in some way to say, well, that mail order pharmacy is not necessarily, quote, "readily accessible" because I can't walk up to it like I can my local on-the-corner pharmacy.

So that's -- I just wanted to get that potentially on the record to make sure that we were clear on that, and otherwise I think the language is -- is fine, so thank you.

CHAIRMAN SCHULTZ: Thank you, Kevin.

And by "readily accessible," as I understand it, often you can receive calls, you can receive e-mails, texts, electronic communications, and that you serve multiple areas of the marketplace in terms of many different kinds of clients, many different health plans, and you

              And so just on behalf of AALIW, which is the
24
    organization of attorneys that represent injured
25
    workers, we would like to go on the record to the
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extent any of the proposed changes limit an injured worker's accessibility to different ways to obtain their prescription medication.

Many of our clients aren't able to go to an actual physical pharmacy, and so they rely on some of the different mail order pharmacies to get their medications. It's just another convenience for them, some of whom are very severely injured and can't drive or can't access public transportation.

And to the extent that any of the proposed changes limit that convenience for injured workers, our organization would be strongly opposed to it.

Thank you, Chairman.

sure that you were sorely missed by your clients that
you represent, and I hope you're back healthy and will
stay healthy. We like to see you around the place.
